**The Path of Democracy takes you
through the federal government
district in Bonn. 20 large illustrated
panels recall Germany's democratic
history whilst also highlighting
the structural change of the past
few years.**

The stops en route provide information about
important places where policy decisions were
taken in the former government district. You will
discover, among other things, the Museum
Koenig, where the Parliamentary Council met,
the former lecture hall of the Pedagogic
Academy, where the Basic Law was debated
and adopted, the official seats of the Federal
Presidents and the Federal Chancellors and also
see where the German Bundestag convened.

The walking tour of stops 1 – 12 takes about
two hours. The locations 13 – 19 lie to the
north and south of the actual path itself.
Apart from the large illustrated panels, you
will also find smaller plaques with interesting
facts about the government district. Further
places of historical and political importance
in the town centre are also marked with small
wall plaques.
